Abstract description of the film

Nili Portugali takes a deeply personal and intimate journey to the Galilean holy Kabbalah picturesque city of **Tzefat (Israel)**, the birth place and home of her family for 7 generations, where her grandmother had founded her hotel 65 years ago in a small stone building around a patio at the end of an alley in the old city (Hotel Tel-Aviv).

Tzefat, is one of the four holy cities in Israel located on the mountains of the Galilee dated to the period of the second temple. Haven to thousands of Jews; prominent mystics; masters of Kabbalah and scholars of religious law who were expelled from Spain and Portugal in the 15th 16th, turning the city to the most important spiritual center of the Jewish community of Israel. A city where religious orthodox Jews; the old Yishuv traditional Jews; secular people and artists enchanted by her beauty, **lived side by side in harmony** and simplicity. But for Portugali Tzefat are the alleys where her grandmother walked and the stone walls covered with the peeling plaster that her hands has touched. Memories 'engraved' on every stone of the city's stones being a microdocument of the characters; events and history of the city **Tzefat** for hundreds of years

Now after the last generation of people that have carried on their shoulders more than 1000 years of history have passed away and when a city of cultural asset printed in our collective Jewish memory 'does not exist anymore' and is totally forgotten, Portugali is reconstructing her childhood memories in a poetic and unique cinematic language. Memories that soon unfolds to a discovery of universal insights from her present holistic - phenomenological point of view of what is the secret behind all those places that arouse in us emotional experience in which man feels 'at home', and what is that one timeless pure art of making (adopted by her grandmother in her daily life at her kitchen) which is thousands of years old, and the same today as it has always been which created the great buildings, the villages, tents and temples in which man feels at home? at any culture, at any place and at any time.

Portugali is a well-known practicing architect for more than 40 years (born in Israel, 1948).

A 7th generation descendant of the Berenson family who lives in the holly Galilee city of **Tzefat**, since the early 19th century and the granddaughter of Dr. Nissan Kahan, founder of the Zionist movement in Hungary (Herzl's right hand).

She was a senior lecturer at the Bezalel Academy of Art and Design, Department of Architecture, Jerusalem and at the Faculty of Architecture and Town Planning at the Technion, Haifa

Her work is documented worldwide in books, in the Dictionair De l'Architeture Du xxe Scielle / Hazan Publication France, in professional magazines, in the press and on television.

Her **multidisciplinary** work in the **Visual arts & Architecture** focuses on both practice and theory closely connected to the **holistic-phenomenological school of thought**.

She is a graduate of prestigious 'Architectural Association School of Architecture' (A.A.), London. She did post graduate studies in Architecture and Buddhism at the University of California, Berkeley, worked and participating in research with Prof. Christopher Alexander at the 'Center for Environmental Structure', Berkeley. She did selected postgraduate studies in film at the Tel-Aviv University.
